Learn how to read charts, identify symbols and legends, compute distance/speed/time (60D=ST), True/Magnetic/Compass course (TVMDC), plotting lat/long, etc. Boat Crew Qualification PQS tasks BCM-06-01, 06-04 thru 07 will be covered. Please bring your charting/plotting tools.

PE Management in AD2: The target audience for this class are the newly created FSO-RSs and SO-RSs, as well as anyone doing surface operations. We have a power point presentation from BSX and will need access to projection equipment. Training Management: How to use and generate reports in Auxiliary Directory, National Websites and AUXDATA II to help our leaders assist their members.

Public Affairs: This class is targeting current and future SO's/FSO PA's (Public Affairs Officers) and anyone interested in Public Affairs (PA). The class has been designed to assist you in becoming a Qualified Public Affairs Professional (AUX-PA3). Instruction will include learning about the role of Public Affairs in the Aux and Active Duty, that thoroughly covers the PQS and associated support network for becoming qualified as an AUX-PA3, learning how to use your smartphone camera to cover PA events, and hear from an active-duty Public Affairs team member on how Aux Public Affairs can support and augment the active duty.
